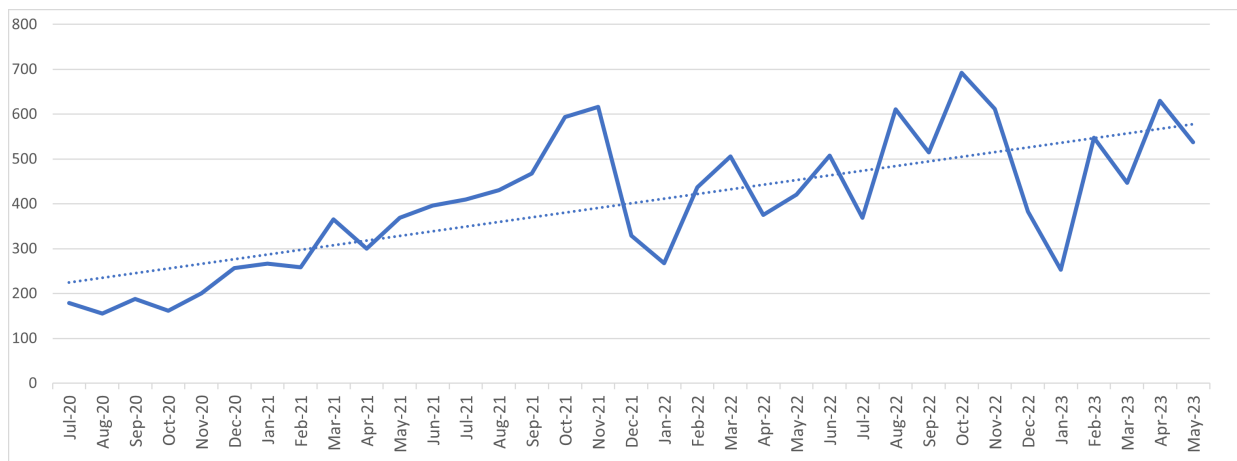

“NZFN provides Champion with a simple procedure for identifying, allocating and delivering surplus stock. A list is submitted to NZFN, who respond on the same day with stock requirements. Picking, collection and deliveries are then organised for the next day. HOW NZFN BENEFITS OUR FOOD HUBS

“We registered with NZFN as our foodbank resources were continually sporadic. Belonging to this Network and knowing that we have food coming in on a regular basis has worked so well for our planning and implementation. We have been able to reach and support more whānau in remote areas as far as Potaka (top of the East Cape) to Nuhaka (our boundary with Hawke’s Bay) since working with NZFN.
